## NEW METHOD FOR DISTRIBUTION OF *THE CONNECTION*

The Alumni Advisory Board has decided to cut some of our expenses by sending *The Connection* by e-mail. For those who are unable to receive it in this manner, we will continue to print and send it by snail mail. Paul Amos reported that our current list of alumni numbered 689 as of October 2006. A later figure supplied by Dick Olson gives us 935 names. This includes everyone that the mission is aware of from volunteers to retired employees. Some 800 copies are currently printed and distributed.



## THE AABOARD PRESENTS A PROJECT

The AA Board wants to encourage TWR to continue to give the TWR Alumni Organization its assistance and backing. We currently receive financial help as well as advice and guidance from Cary's human resources department. However, we would like to reciprocate this confidence by inviting the alumni to participate in a yearly missions project. We are suggesting that as you feel led and as God enables to send a financial gift to TWR and identify it as for the Alumni Project. For the year 2007 three projects have been recommended. **We are asking you to vote for one which will be our special interest this year.** Please send your response by the 15<sup>th</sup> of March to Skip Britton at [skipbritton@earthlink.net](mailto:skipbritton@earthlink.net) or by letter to Joan Britton at 148 Dovenshire Dr., Crossville, TN, 38558. The recommended projects are:

- 1) **The Spanish-language children's program *Pedrito el Pulpo*.** Children by the thousands are listening every week and requesting the storybooks and other materials. Rallies are sponsored and school kits are distributed which include the storybooks and a CD of a Pedrito program. In the past four years 29,056 people attended these rallies, with 2,779 decisions for Christ. In addition, 2,757 school kits have been given to needy children.
- 2) **A youth program in Arabic and Berber.** There is a \$35,000 matching grant for this project. By helping to sponsor this, we will bring it closer to the goal.
- 3) **A transmitter project for the Northern part of Benin.** Ministry is going on in a number of new languages in the region. This outreach is especially directed to those in an oral and storytelling people group.

We trust that you will consider these ideas and pray about participating.

Attending the meetings were Dr. Duff and Marge Brown (whose term has ended), Duane and Millie Gow, Rodger Groff, Rob and Linda Lincoln, Denny and Susie Milgate, Jeanne Olson, Ann Polloni, Chuck and Barbara Roswell, and Skip and Joan Britton. Art and Karin Thompson were unable to attend, as he had been called to serve in jury duty. John Polloni was unable to attend because of his health at that time.

Our special guests on Saturday morning were Samuel Chiang, Chief Operating Officer for TWR, Tim Klingbeil, Chief Development Officer, and Kris Carraway, Director of Human Resources. Samuel gave us an update on TWR worldwide, current projects, involvements and needs. He also introduced the new leadership structure called the Global Coordination Group. It consists of a maximum of 12 persons, comprising a core group, and "invitees" representing all the regions and some of the key areas of global operation. Tim Klingbeil informed us about three recommended projects for the TWR Alumni. Kris Carraway is our liaison with TWR and brought us up to speed on our status and situation in the absence of an Alumni Director.
